As most of you know, the building of St James' was closed for nearly 40 years and was one of the very first churches to be reopened for mission and ministry. Being part of this church is an amazing adventure. Since we re-opened, alongside the Liverpool Next Generation (LNG) project, we have together discipled over 2000 people: the average age of whom is 24.



Our vision is to resource the next generation, which resonates with the text from Matthew 19 on the front of this booklet and in the main stained-glass window in church. If you are part of this church, then I hope you feel like you are helping to build for the future.


The Church is predominantly a self-funded organisation. Your regular financial giving is the baseline against which all our ministry is planned and conducted.


Our Vicars and Curate salaries are paid for by the Diocese. We pay the Diocese an annual contribution (parish share) and we pay for 50% curate housing costs. We receive grant funding from several sources, including the LNG Project which stops in Summer 2025.

To continue ministry in it's current form, we need to

Within the landscape of the wider Church, we have a particular focus on Resourcing the Next Generation. That means we want everyone in our Church family to actively hand on the baton of faith to those who come after us.

We prioritise mission and evangelism to younger demographics because these are the missing generation, sadly so often absent from Church.

To-Do in 2025:

- Strengthen financial giving
- Get functional heating system
- Fix the issues with our building
- Develop church site for future use
- Illumination for the building for better visibility
- Strengthen finances to enable us to continue university and schools work as grant funding ends this year
- Reach out to people who have been part of our Church in the past to see whether they would like to support us

As a Resource Church we also have a focus on church planting. We want to help churches throughout our diocese to become better versions of themselves by sending planting teams to Revitalise existing communities, becoming effective in mission and discipleship and viable for the long-term. We've started our first Revitalisation at St Mary's Wavertree and we hope to do more.

The 250th anniversary of our building is a great moment to celebrate all that God has done amongst us and focus on the immediate challenges of becoming more like Jesus and more effective at what we do.
